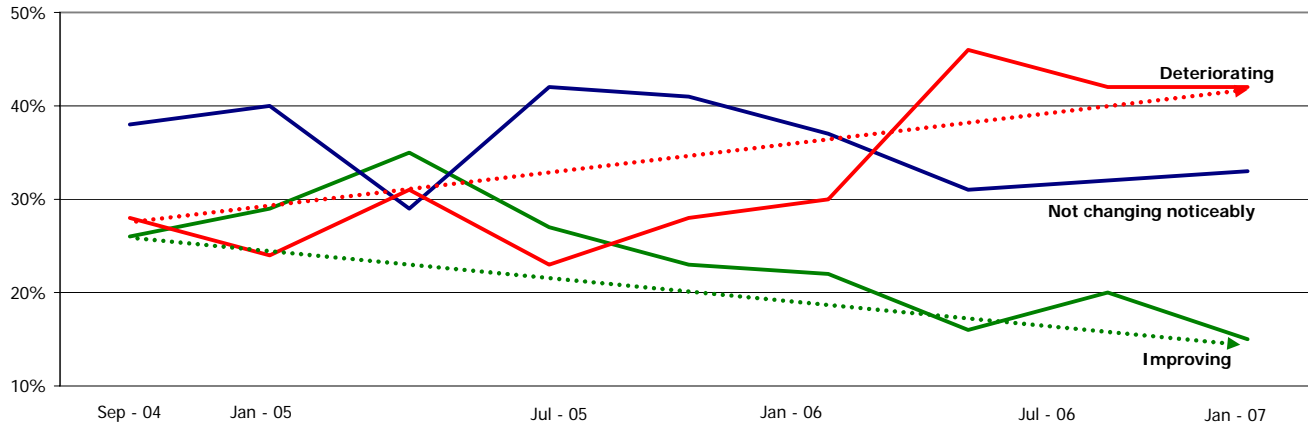


Quarterly YouGov Health Trends survey: Sep 2004 - Jan 2007

1. Over the last 12 months, do you think that the NHS has been deteriorating, not changing noticeably or improving?

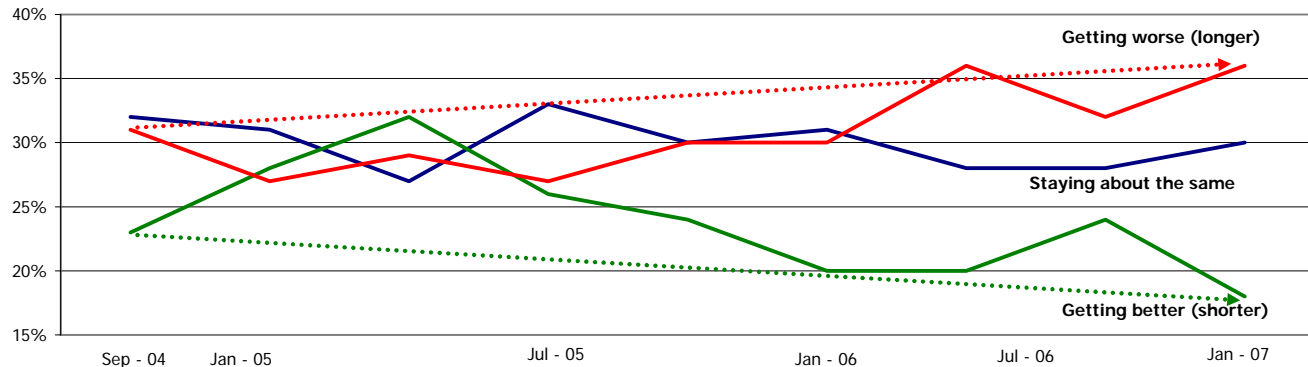


Comment as at January 2007:

1. Less people think the NHS is improving while more think it is deteriorating
2. NHS waiting lists are getting better contrary to question 1. The differences are small but could be because there has been a focus on MRSA recently in the media

An interesting insight from looking at all the data is that the Scots are happier with the NHS than they were a year ago while there has been a significant downturn in the South

2. Do you think NHS waiting lists are getting worse (longer), staying about the same or getting better (shorter)?
